

Running a WWFF National Program

General

- World Wide Flora & Fauna (WWFF) was established in 2012
- WWFF encourages portable ham radio operations, with a particular focus on operating from nature reserves and other protected areas
 - Those operating from WWFF "references" (= areas) are activators
 - Those trying to work the activators from home are hunters
- Website at https://wwff.co
 - Directory of WWFF references
 - "Logsearch" plugin: log, award, and directory handling + statistics
 - DX cluster and "Agenda" for upcoming activations

- As of April 2025, there are over 63,000 WWFF references in 301 DXCC countries
- WWFF is busy every day of the year
 - In 2024, about 1,400 activators made 1,500,000 QSOs from 10,000 WWFF references in 79 DXCC countries, with 18,000 hunters making min. 10 QSOs

General

- World Wide Flora & Fauna (WWFF) consists of country-level Flora & Fauna programs = national programs (62 listed as of April 2025)
- WWFF can be seen as an umbrella organization that provides
 - General rules
 - IT infrastructure (log, award & directory management, statistics)
- The national programs have duties for their countries
 - 1. Receiving, checking, and uploading activator logs to "Logsearch"
 - 2. Issuing country-specific activator & hunter awards
 - 3. Managing the WWFF reference directory in "Logsearch"
 - 4. Communicating with the WWFF decision team
- The national programs have the freedom and flexibility to
 - Create country-specific awards
 - Run local events
 -



General

- The program name is the prefix + FF for "Flora & Fauna": 4OFF, 4XFF, etc.
- Usually the programs also have a dedicated logo, a website, etc.

Running a National program

- The national program is managed by a "National coordinator"
 - The coordinator is authorized by the WWFF decision team
- In small programs, the coordinator can handle all duties
 - Receive, check, and upload activator logs
 - Issue country-specific activator & hunter awards
 - Manage the WWFF reference directory
 - Communicate with the WWFF decision team
- In large and busy programs, the duties can be shared between several individuals, as appointed by the national coordinator
 - National coordinator (general management and development)
 - Log manager(s)
 - Award manager
 - Directory manager
 - Website manager
 - etc.

Log management

- The national program can set up for example an e-mail address for receiving activator logs in the country
 - Log file format: ADI
 - Log file naming convention: DL1ABC-P @ DLFF-1234 20250315.ADI

- Together with the submitted log, the program may request GPSbased evidence – like a phone screenshot – to prove that the activator was inside the claimed WWFF reference (see rule 3.15)
- Tasks of the national coordinator or log manager(s)
 - Check the log internally for consistency: date, callsign, WWFF reference, etc.
 - Check the possible GPS-based evidence
 - Upload the log to the wwff.co "Logsearch" database

Award management

- WWFF handles activator & hunter awards for global totals
 - https://wwff.co/awards/global-awards/
- National programs are encouraged to have their own awards
 - 1. Activator & hunter awards for WWFF references within that program
 - 2. Worked all geographic regions within the country
 - 3. Band/mode-specific awards
 - 4. Special event awards
- Logsearch supports #1: activator & hunter awards with desired levels
 - For example 10, 44, etc. activated references; 10, 44, 100, etc. hunted refs
 - Logsearch users can apply for awards after reaching the numerical threshold
 - After a user applies, Logsearch sends an e-mail to the manager
- Tasks of the national coordinator or award manager
 - Prepares the award templates
 - Prepares award PDFs based on received applications
 - Sends the award by e-mail to the recipient

Directory management

- WWFF references must be protected areas or similar nature reserves
 - Eligible areas/reserves may often be listed on https://www.protectedplanet.net
 - National government listings may be more up to date and precise
 - See WWFF rule 15.3: having an IUCN category number is another clue about area eligibility
 - NOTE: regular parks without protected status do not qualify
 - Naming convention is "National program Number": DLFF-0023, VKFF-2411, ...
- A national program can add 200 new references per year
 - Exceptions for geographically very large countries
- New references are added through a form in Logsearch, then approved by the global WWFF directory manager
- Global WWFF maps are available at https://wwff.co/directory/map/
 - Some national programs also maintain their own custom maps (e.g., https://kartta.ohff.fi) and/or Google Earth KMZ files for showing reference boundaries (e.g., https://dlff.info/index.php/dlff-gebiete/)
